# 1 What is Quinté+

Quinté+ is a lottery style jackpot game based on a horse racing event organised by PMU. Players select five (5) unique numbers from a pre-determined pool of numbers, which typically range from one (1) to twenty (20). The size of the pool corresponds to the number of horses participating in the race, which may vary from one event to another. The winning results are determined by the first five (5) horses to finish the race, with their corresponding numbers forming the winning combination.

There are four (4) ways of winning in Quinté+. A first prize category is won when matching the five (5) numbers chosen in exact order, a second prize category is won when matching the five (5) numbers in any order, a third prize category is won when matching four (4) numbers out of five (5) and the fourth prize category is won when matching 3 numbers in any order from the top three (3) finishers.



# 2 Quinté+ Ticket Description

The ticket is the unique valid document for winning prizes. The following is an illustration that represents a visual of the Quinté+ ticket, including the information displayed on the ticket.

- Ticket Number
- PIN
- Agent Number
- Date and time of purchase
- Quinté+ Horserace Racetrack Location and date and time of the event
- Numbers selected, game type, Quick Pick selection, aka Quinte+ Spot, stake and Replacement Horse
- Total Cost
- Barcode

It is the player's entire responsibility to ensure that the selections printed on the ticket are correct as in line with the ones selected.

Ticket cancellations will not be permitted once a ticket has been confirmed and paid in full.

# 3 How is Quinté+ Played

#### 3.1 Simple Column

To play a Simple Column in Quinté+, the player should select five (5) numbers from a predetermined pool of numbers by verbally communicating the choices to the authorised agent at any National Lottery or IZIBET point of sales.

For the Quinté+ game, a column is defined as one combination of five (5) numbers created from the selected numbers.

One Simple Column in Quinté+ costs €2. Increments of €0.50 can be added to the ticket for a larger share of the total available prizes.

#### 3.2 Quick Pick (Quinte+ Spot)

Quinté+ Spot, or Quick Pick is a fully automatic number selection method whereby the terminal generates five (5) random numbers.

If the 'Selection Spot' is activated, the Reserve Horse is also chosen at random. The selection of numbers generated by the terminal will be displayed on the ticket once printed.

The cost of one Simple Column remains €2.

#### 3.3 Replacement Horse or Reserve Horse

In Quinté+, players have the option to designate a Replacement Horse (Number) or a Reserve Horse (Number). This feature allows the selection of an additional number representing a horse, which will automatically replace any non-runner in the race. The Replacement Horse removes the non-runner and completes the wager by placing the number in the last position, as if the reserve horse has been listed last.

The reserve horse designated by the player must be a horse participating in the race, but it must be different from the other five (5) horses in the selection.

#### Example:

In one Quinté+ wager, the chosen numbers are 1-2-3-4-5 and 9 was chosen as the Reserved Horse. Number 3 is declared as a non-runner. In this case, Number 9, will be included in the bet and will be listed as the last number, therefore, the final and effective selection becomes: 1-2-4-5-9



#### 3.4 Non-Runner

A horse may be declared a non-runner in accordance with the applicable Rules of Racing. The number associated with that horse is omitted from the available pool of numbers. In the event that there is more than one non-runner from the selection of numbers and replacement numbers, then the ticket will participate in another product category as shown in the table below.

With 1 non-runner in the Quinté+ Wager <sup>(1)</sup>	New Winning Category <sup>(2)</sup>
If you match the remaining 4 horses in the exact order with the first 4 horses placed.	You win in the Quarté+ Exact Order category
If you match the remaining 4 horses in any order with the first 4 horses placed	You win in the Quarté+ Any Order category
If you match 3 horses in any order with the first 3 horses placed	You win in the Quarté+ Bonus category

<sup>(2)</sup> Win proportional to your winning Quinté+ bet.

In the event of bets in which at least two (2) or more horses are non-runners, and no Reserve Horse was selected, the bet will be refunded by National Lottery.

If a Reserve Horse was selected, and one (1) of the horses in a bet is a non-runner, the Reserve Horse will automatically be included in the bet by being positioned in the last place of the bet. If there are two (2) non-runners in the bet, the Reserve Horse will replace only one of them. In both cases, the bet will not be refunded.

In the event that there are two non-runners, and the Reserve Horse rule was applied, the Quinté+ with one (1) non-runner rule applies, and therefore the Quinté+ bet will then be requalified as a Quarté+ bet.

Refunds will be automatically processed by the system at the shops after the race concludes.

#### 3.5 Cancellations

Once a bet is placed, it is considered final. Cancellations or modifications are not permitted after the bet has been confirmed and paid for.

#### 3.6 Dead Heat

#### 3.6.1 Dead Heat Definition

A **Dead Heat** occurs in a race or competition when two or more competitors finish at exactly the same position or achieve an identical result, making it impossible to determine a clear winner based on the standard criteria used.

In betting terms, a dead heat is treated as a tie, and the payout is adjusted in accordance with the below terms:

In the case of a dead heat finish, payable combinations corresponding to the Quinté+ Exact Order, or to the Quinté+ Any Order are as follows:

- a) In the case of a dead heat for first place of five or more horses, the payable combinations are all those involving the horses classified first, taken five by five. For each combination, a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend is awarded by convention to the one hundred and twenty possible orders of finish of the five horses in the same combination.
- **b)** In the case of a dead heat for first place of four horses and one or more horses classified fifth, the payable combinations are those involving the four horses classified first with one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the twenty-four permutations whereby the horses classified first have been selected in the four first places. For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the ninety-six permutations whereby any one of the horses classified first has been selected in fifth place.

c) In the case of a dead heat for first place of three horses and two or more horses for fourth place, payable combinations are those of the three horses classified first with two of the horses classified fourth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the twelve permutations whereby the three horses classified first have been selected in the three first places and two of the horses classified fourth have been selected in fourth and fifth place.



For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eight permutations whereby any one of the horses classified first has been selected in fourth or fifth place.

d) In the case of a dead heat for first place of three horses, one single horse classified fourth, and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the three horses classified first with the horse classified fourth and one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the six permutations whereby the horses classified first have been selected in the first three places and the fourth horse has been selected in fourth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and fourteen permutations whereby any one of the horses classified first has been selected in either fourth or fifth place, or whereby the horse classified fourth has been selected in fifth place.

e) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, and three horses or more dead heat for third place, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with three horses classified third.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the twelve permutations whereby the two horses classified first have been selected in the first two places and three of the horses in third place have been selected in third, fourth and fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eight permutations whereby one of the horses classified first has been selected in either third, fourth or fifth place.

f) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, two horses dead heat for third place, and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with the two horses classified third and one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the four permutations whereby the horses classified first have been selected in the first two places and the horses classified third have been selected in third and fourth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and sixteen permutations whereby one of the horses classified first has been selected in third, fourth or fifth place or whereby one of the horses classified third has been selected in first, second, or fifth place.

g) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, one horse classified third and two or more horses classified fourth, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with the horse classified third and two of the horses classified fourth.



For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the four permutations whereby the horses classified first have been selected in the first two places and two of the horses classified fourth have been selected in fourth and fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and sixteen permutations whereby one of the horses classified first has been selected in third, fourth or fifth place, or whereby one of the horses classified fourth has been selected in first, second or third place.

h) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, one horse classified third, one horse fourth and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with the horses classified third and fourth and with one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the two permutations whereby the two horses classified first have been selected in the first two places, the horse classified third has been selected in third place, the horse classified fourth selected in fourth place and the horse classified fifth selected in fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eighteen permutations whereby any one of the horses classified first has been selected in third, fourth or fifth place, or whereby one of the three other horses has been selected in a place other than its place of finish.

i) In the case of a dead heat for second place of four or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first, with four of the horses classified second.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the twenty-four permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the ninety-six permutations whereby the horse classified first has not been selected in first place.

**j)** In the case of a dead heat for second place of three horses and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first, with the three horses classified second and any one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the six permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place and any one of the horses classified fifth has been selected in fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and fourteen permutations whereby the horse classified first or any one of the horses classified fifth has been selected in a place other than its place of finish.

k) In the case of a dead heat for second place of two horses and two or more horses for fourth place, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first, with the two horses classified second and two of the horses classified fourth.



For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the four permutations whereby the two horses classified second have been selected in second and third place and the horses classified fourth have been selected in fourth and fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and sixteen permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in second, third, fourth or fifth place or whereby one of the horses classified second has been selected in first, fourth or fifth place.

I) In the case of a dead heat for second place of two horses, one horse is classified fourth, and one or more horses are classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first, with the two horses classified second, the horse classified fourth, and one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the two permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place, the horse classified fourth has been selected in fourth place, and any one of the horses classified fifth has been selected in fifth place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eighteen permutations whereby the horse classified first, the horse classified fourth, or the horse classified fifth have been selected in a place other than its place of finish.

**m)** In the case of a dead heat for third place of three or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first two places with three of the horses classified third.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the six permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place and the horse classified second has been selected in second place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and fourteen permutations whereby the horse classified first or the horse classified second have been selected in a place other than its place of finish.

n) In the case of a dead heat for third place of two horses and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first two places with the two horses classified third, and with one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the two permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place, the horse classified second has been selected second, and the horse classified fifth has been selected fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eighteen permutations whereby the horses classified first, second or fifth have been selected in a place other than their place of finish.

**o)** In the case of a dead heat for fourth place of two or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classifies at the first three places with two of the horses classified fourth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the two permutations whereby the horse classified first has been selected in first place, the horse classified second has been selected second and the horse classified third has been selected in third place.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and eighteen permutations whereby the horses classified first, second or third have been selected in a place other than their place of finish.

**p)** In the case of a dead heat for fifth place of two or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first four places with one of the horses classified fifth.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Exact Order" dividend for the selection of the four first horses in their respective order of finish.

For each combination, there is a single "Quinté+ Any Order" dividend for the one hundred and nineteen permutations whereby one of the five horses has been selected in a place other than its place of finish.

# In the case of a dead heat finish, payable combinations corresponding to the "Bonus 4 out of 5" dividend are as follows:

- a) In the case of a dead heat for first place of five or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classified first taken four by four and one horse classified after fifth place.
- b) In the case of a dead heat for first place of four horses and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horses classified first and one horse classified after fifth place or those of the horses classified first taken three by three with one horse classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place.
- c) In the case of a dead heat for first place of three horses and one or more horses classified fourth, payable combinations are those of the three horses classified first, one of the horses classified fourth, and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of two of the horses classified first with three horses classified fourth, or those of two of the horses classified first with three horses classified fourth, or those of two of the horses classified first with two horses classified fourth and one horse after fifth place.
- d) In the case of a dead heat for first place of three horses, one single horse classified fourth and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the three horses classified first with the horse classified fourth and one horse after fifth place, or those of the three horses classified first with two of the horses classified fifth, or those of the three horses classified first with one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of two of the horses classified first with the horse classified fourth and two of the horses classified fifth, or those of two of the horses classified first with the horse



classified fourth, with one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place.

- e) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses and three or more horses classified third, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with two of the horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified first with four horses classified third, or those of one of the horses classified first with three of the horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place.
- f) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, two horses classified third and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first with the two horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the two horses classified first with one of the horses classified third and two horses classified fifth, or those of the two horses classified first with one of the horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified fifth, or those of one of the two horses classified third and two of the horses classified fifth, or those of one of the horses classified first with the two horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified third and two of the horses classified fifth, or those of one of the horses classified first with the two horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place.
- g) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses, one horse classified third and two or more horses classified fourth, payable combinations are those of the two horses classified first, the horse classified third, one of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the two horses classified first with three of the horses classified fourth, or those of the two horses classified first with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified first with the horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified first with the horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified first with the horse classified third and three of the horses classified fourth, or those of one of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified third and three of the horses classified fourth, or those of one of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified third and three of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified first with the horse classified third, with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified first with the horse classified third, with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place.

- j) In the case of a dead heat for second place of three horses and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first with the three horses classified second and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horse classified first with two of the horses classified second and two horses classified fifth, or those of the horse classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the three horses classified second with two of the horses classified fifth, or those of the three horses classified second with one of the horses classified fifth, or those of the three horses classified second with one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified fifth, or those of the three horses classified second with one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place.
- k) In the case of a dead heat for second place of two horses and one or more horses classified fourth, payable combinations are those of the horse classified first with the two horses classified second and one of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horse classified first with one of the horses classified second, two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified second and three of the horses classified fourth, or those of the two horses classified second with three of the horses classified fourth, or those of the two horses classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified second with two of the horses classified fourth and one horse classified after fifth place.

- m) In the case of a dead-heat for third place of three or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first two places with two of the horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places and four of the horses classified third, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places with three of the horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place.
- n) In the case of a dead-heat for third place of two horses and one or more horses classified fifth, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first two places, the two horses classified third and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of the horses classified at the first two places, one of the horses classified third and two of the horses classified fifth, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places with the two horses classified third and two of the horses classified third and two of the horses classified at the first two places with the two horses classified third and two of the horses classified at the first two places with one of the horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places with one of the horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places with one of the horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified at the first two places with one of the horses classified third, one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of one of the horses classified at the first

- p) In the case of a dead-heat for fifth place of two or more horses, payable combinations are those of the horses classified at the first four places and one horse classified after fifth place, or those of three of the horses classified at the first four places with two of the horses classified fifth, or those of three of the horses classified at the first four places with one of the horses classified fifth and one horse classified after fifth place.

# III. In the case of a dead heat finish, payable combinations corresponding to the "Bonus 3" dividend are as follows:

- a) In the case of a dead heat for first place of three or more horses, payable combinations are all those of three horses classified first and two horses both classified after fifth place.
- b) In the case of a dead heat for first place of two horses and one or more horses are classified third, payable combinations are all those of the two horses classified first, one horse classified third, and two horses both classified after fifth place.
- c) In the case of a dead heat for second place of two or more horses, payable combinations are all those of the horse classified first, two of the horses classified second and two horses both classified after fifth place.
- d) In the case of a dead heat for third place of two or more horses, payable combinations are all those of the horses classified at the first two places with one of the horses classified third and two horses both classified after fifth place.



#### 3.7 Systems

A Fully Expanded System entry or Combinations, is an alternative way of playing Quinté+, providing the player with more chances to win. A Combination bet allows the player to select more than the minimum required, i.e. more than five (5) numbers, and thus register all possible single combinations with these horses (numbers) according to the chosen bet type.

#### 3.8 Systems – All Orders

The All Orders option, allows the player to play a selection of horse numbers in all possible orders. This means that for each five (5) horse combination in one selection, the player is selecting one hundred and twenty (120) possible orders of finish.

This results in creating 120 different combinations of €2 each, therefore the total ticket cost would be €240.

If the horses associated to the five (5) numbers selected, place in the exact order in the top 5, than the player win with one (1) combination of Exact Order and 119 combinations in Any Order.

If the bet includes four (4) horses out of the five (5) finishers, the player win 120 combinations from the 4 out of 5 winning category.

If the bet includes three (3) numbers from the top three (3) finishers, the player wins 120 combinations from the Bonus3 category.

Example of Combination (in simplified formula):

You select 7 horses (for example, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14) and you want to play all possible combinations of 5 horses among these 7.

This bet would generate 21 single combinations (7! / (5! x 2!))

The total cost of the bet would be the number of combinations multiplied by the stake of €2.

#### 3.9 Full Field and Partial Field (Reduced Field)

Full Field, Partial Field or sometimes called Reduced Field, is a betting formula that allows you to select one or more horses as base(s) and combine then with all other horses in the race or a selection of them.

- (a) Full Field: The player chooses one or more base horses and combine them with all other horses in the race.
- (b) Partial Field: The player chooses one or more base horses and combine them a selection of other horses in the race.

The Free Field is a formula that encompasses all ( $P \times P' \times P'' \times P''' \times P''''$ ) unit combinations in a specified relative order, combining P horses in first place, P' horses in second place, P'' in third place, P''' in fourth place, and P'''' in fifth place.

This playing option allows players to narrow down the possible combinations, by covering a broader range of outcomes without being on every possible combination. With this playing option, players select less than the minimum required of numbers and then pair these with additional secondary numbers to complete their combinations.

The above gaming options specified in section 3.6, 3.7 and 3.8, allow players to cover more possibilities in their bets, thus increasing their chances of winning, but also the cost of the bet



Note that the Single, Combination, Reduced Field, and Full Field formulas can also be played in the 'In All Orders' formula. In this case, the bet will include all permutations of the unit combinations resulting from the chosen game formula.

#### 1. Example of Full Field (in simplified formula):

You choose horse 7 as the base, and you want to associate it with all other horses in the race for the 4 other places.

Your bet would be: 7 with all other horses (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18) This bet would generate 57,120 unit combinations (17 x 16 x 15 x 14).

#### 2. Example of Partial Field (in simplified formula):

You choose horse 7 as the base, and you want to associate it with 8 other horses of your choice for the 4 other places.

Your bet could be: 7 with 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16

This bet would generate 1,680 unit combinations (8 x 7 x 6 x 5).

In each of the above examples, the total cost of the bet would be the number of combinations multiplied by the stake of  $\leq 2$ .

The below tables shows the total cost of bets based on the number of selected base horses and additional secondary horses.

### 4 Quinté+ Events

#### 4.1 When can Quinté+ be Played?

Quinté+ is available daily from Monday to Sunday. However, on certain Sundays, a special event with a significant minimum jackpot is offered. These special event dates are determined by PMU, the organiser of horse race pool betting in France.

The table below provides the standard schedule when Quinté+ is offered. Changes may occur to the schedule. All changes would be duly announced.

On certain event dates, the time may be indicative.

Tickets for a Quinté+ event can be purchased after the conclusion of the previous Quinté+ race. For Quinté+ events taking place on Sunday, tickets can be purchased on the day before, i.e. on Saturday following the completion of Saturday's race, at approximately 16:30hrs.

All Quinté+ events are available for viewing at National Lottery and IZIBET shops through dedicated display screens. The results of the Quinté+ events on selected Sundays are made available on dedicated display screens inside the shops and on the social media platforms of the Company. National Lottery plc may also make the draw results available at instore.lottery.mt

Results will only be published once they have been approved as official by the racing authorities. Occasionally, results may be delayed due to steward inquiries.

#### 4.2 How is the Event conducted?

The Quinté+ is conducted as a lottery-style game based on the outcome of a horse racing event taking place as duly organised by the horse racing betting organisation in France, namely PMU. The outcome of the race determines the outcome of the winning combinations of the Jackpot game.

# 5 Cost of Entry in Quinté+

A Quinté+ ticket with a simple column costs €2.00. Increments of €0.50 can be added to your ticket for a larger share of the total available prizes.

The table below presents the number of Simple Columns created for the possible number of combinations according to the selected numbers in one bet and the respective cost of entry for the mentioned combinations.

#### 5.1 Multiplier

The 'Multiplier' option allows the player to multiply their base stake to increase potential winnings. When selected, the multiplier multiplies the base prize by a certain factor, which increases the prize amount if the bet is successful.

Quinté+ offers multipliers of one (1), two (2), five (5), ten (10), twenty (20), fifty (50), and one hundred (100). If the bet is successful, the winning amount is multiplied accordingly.

# 6 Quinté+ Prizes

#### 6.1 Winning Categories and Distribution of Prizes in Quinté+

To win in Quinté+, the player must match the selected numbers with the drawn numbers. The more numbers the player plays, the greater the winning probabilities.

The prize money in a Quinté+ event is dependent on the sales and is divided among the winners accordingly. The overall payout of the prize pool distributed among the Quinté+ winning ticket holders is 65% of the total sales of the current event.

The reserve coefficient net value allocated to the reserve fund is 0.6%, whilst an additional 4.5% is retained within the reserve fund for allocation to the guaranteed jackpot prize. The "Quinté Reserve Fund" may also be funded occasionally over and above its available amount by specific contributions from advertisers or by the PMU Group.

Following is a table, showing the different winning categories in Quinté+ and the distribution of the prize pool per winning category:

#### 6.2 Quinté+ Jackpot – Tirelire or Piggy Bank

The "Tirelire" Jackpot, or Piggy Bank, is a supplementary amount allocated to the first prize category of Quinté+ (Exact Order). The Tirelire is offered on specific race days chosen by PMU, typically for high profile events or promotional occasions.

The distribution of the prize pool from the 'Quinté+ Exact Order' category + Tirelire dividend is awarded if the five (5) selected horses occupy the first five (5) places, and if the order selected by the player corresponds to the right order of finish of the five (5) horses.

# 7 Additional Information

#### 7.1 Special Cases

 a) When in a race with Quinté+ bets there are no stakes on the payable combination corresponding to the 'Quinté+ Exact Order' dividend or in the event of a dead heat on one of the combinations of five (5) payable horses corresponding to the 'Quinté Exact Order', the share-out surplus corresponding to this combination is allocated to determine the 'Quinté Any Order' dividend of these same horses.

**b)** If, cumulatively, there are no stakes on the payable combination corresponding to the "Quinté Exact Order" dividend and to the "Quinté Any Order" dividend or, in the event of a dead heat, on one of the payable combinations corresponding to the "Quinté Exact Order" dividend and for the same payable combination corresponding to the "Quinté Any Order" dividend, the "Quinté Exact Order" and "Quinté Any Order" share-out surpluses corresponding to this combination are allocated to determine the "Bonus 4out of 5" dividend.

2. a) If, after application of the provisions of 1 b) above, there are no stakes on any one of the payable combinations corresponding to the "Bonus 4 out of 5" dividend, the total amount of the "Bonus 4 out of 5" share-out surplus, is allocated to calculate the "Bonus 3" dividend.

**b)** Finally, if there are no stakes on any of the payable combinations corresponding to the "Quinté Exact Order", "Quinté Any Order", "Bonus 4 out of 5" and "Bonus 3" dividends, all bets in this for the event, are refunded.

- 3. a) When in a race, only four (4) horses are classified at the finish, the "Quinté Exact Order" and "Quinté Any Order" share-out surpluses are added to the "Bonus 4 out of 5" share-out surplus, to constitute a single share-out surplus to be distributed among all the players having selected one of the combinations involving the four classified horses without taking into account the order of finish. If there are no stakes on any of these payable combinations, a single pool is constituted and shared-out following b) below.
  - **b)** When in a race, only three (3) horses are classified at the finish, the share-out balance is distributed among all the players having selected one of the combinations involving the three classified horses without taking into account the order of finish.

Failing stakes on these payable combinations, all bets for the event, are refunded.

c) When in a race, less than three (3) horses are classified at the finish, all bets in this even, are refunded.
