

Playing Guidelines



1 What is Super5 and Super5 PLUS

Super5 is a pool-based game of chance which is played by selecting five (5) unique numbers from a field of forty-nine (49) numbers. A first prize category is won when matching five (5) numbers while secondary and tertiary prize categories are won by matching four (4) or three (3) numbers, respectively.


Super5 PLUS is a pool based second chance add-on game to the Super5 game which is played with the original set of numbers selected by the player for the Super5 game. A second draw from a pool of numbers from one (1) to forty-nine (49) are extracted following the main Super5 draw. If the five (5) drawn Super5 PLUS numbers are matched, the first category prize is won. If four (4) or three (3) numbers are matched, the second or third category prizes are won, respectively.



2 Playslip Description

The Super5 playslip is used by the players before purchasing a Super5 ticket to indicate the selection of numbers or playing options (e.g. quick pick or consecutive draws). Additionally, the playslip gives the player the option to participate in a second draw, Super5 PLUS, with the same set of numbers participated in Super5. The player would need to mark 'X' in the box [YES] under Super5 PLUS.

The following illustration demonstrates how a Super5 playslip is filled in:





3 Super5 Ticket Description

The ticket is the unique valid document for winning prizes. The following is an illustration that represents a visual of the Super5 ticket, including the information displayed on the ticket.

- Game logo
- Draw date in which the ticket is participating
- Validity of the ticket, including draw number
- Barcode number
- Playing Board(s), including: Numbers chosen, Quick Pick if selected, Number of Combinations
- Super5 PLUS participation (Yes/No)
- Price of the ticket
- Ticket number
- Date and Time of purchase
- Barcode with Retailer ID



It is the player's entire responsibility to ensure that the selections printed on the ticket are correct as in line with the ones selected.

The player has the possibility to cancel a ticket from an authorised agent, up to 10 minutes after the purchase but not later than the stipulated cancel close time.



4 How Super5 and Super5 PLUS is Played

4.1 Simple Columns

To play a Simple Column in Super5, the player should mark five (5) numbers (with an 'X'), in at least one (1) of the eight (8) Playing Boards (Boards) available on the playslip.

For the Super5 game, a column is defined as one combination of 5 numbers created from the selected numbers.

To participate in the Super5 PLUS draw, the player should mark the [YES] box at the bottom of the playslip (with an 'X'). The same set of numbers chosen to participate in the first Super5 draw, are also valid for the second draw, Super5 PLUS.

4.2 Systems

A Fully Expanded System entry is an alternative way of playing Super5, providing the player with more chances to win.

A System entry allows the player to select more than the minimum amount of numbers but up to twenty (20) in a single board.

The following table shows the number of columns created in each System and the corresponding winning combinations in each case.

The basic column price for playing Super5 is €3.00.

4.3 Full Quick Pick

Full Quick Pick is a fully automatic number selection method whereby the terminal generates all of the numbers, according to the game rules. The player should mark the Quick Pick box on any one (1) of the eight (8) boards, and a number (up to 20) from the Numbers Area, indicating the total amount of numbers to be chosen by the terminal.

4.4 Partial Quick Pick

Partial Quick Pick is a semi-automatic number selection method, whereby the system generates numbers complementary to the numbers selected by the player or the authorised agent. If the player chooses only some of the numbers in the Numbers Area on one board, the rest of the numbers for the same board are quick picked by the system.



4.5 Different Playing Methods on One Playslip

The terminal allows the player to include different playing methods on one playslip. For example, on the same playslip, the player can play a Simple Column in Board A by selecting five (5) numbers, Systems in Board B and a Quick Pick selection in Board C.

4.6 Cancellation of Playing Board

The player is allowed to cancel one or more of the filled in Boards on the playslip by marking the [VOID] box of the relevant Numbers Area.

4.7 Shares

Shares offer the possibility to a group of players to take advantage of, and participate with more numbers and combinations, thus giving the players more chances to win. This is made possible by splitting the Super5 and Super5 PLUS ticket into 8 to 100 shares. The price of the total Super5 ticket is split equally between the number of players.

All players pay their shared Super5 ticket separately and get their own share of the Super5 ticket receipt. For example, if a \le 60 ticket is split into ten (10) parts for ten (10) players, the price of each part is \le 6, whereby each player pays for the share of the participation.

The minimum price of the share is $\in 4$ and the maximum price is $\in 32$.

The Super5 PLUS ticket is split into the same number of shares as the corresponding Super5 ticket.

The maximum price of the whole shared ticket shall be \leq 5,000.



5 Super5 Draws

5.1 When can Super5 be played?

Players can play Super5 from Monday to Sunday during the allowed playing hours, excluding the draw break. The Super5 and Super5 PLUS draws are conducted every Wednesday and Friday.

The draws are broadcast live on TV, with the live stream and recorded draws, also available on the National Lottery website. Participation is allowed until 30 mins before the draw time.

5.2 How is the Draw conducted?

The Super5 and Super5 PLUS draws are held in the presence of:

- i. A representative of the Authority
- ii. A Notary Public

The Notary Public, who will be present at the draw, will draw up and sign a record of the proceedings which is entered in a register, kept for that purpose.

5.3 Consecutive Draws

The player is given the choice to participate with the same playslip in more than one draw by marking a relative box/es in the 'CONSECUTIVE DRAWS' section.

The player has the possibility to increase the frequency of participation by two (2) up to ten (10) draws, by marking the respective box from two (2) to ten (10) within the 'CONSECUTIVE DRAWS' section. Additionally, the player may further increase the selected number of participation draws by marking the [x2] and/or [x3] box/es.

The player can participate up to a maximum of 60 consecutive draws.

Example: If a player selects the boxes [7] and [x3] in the 'CONSECUTIVE DRAWS' section, his playslip will participate in 21 Consecutive draws.



6 Cost of Entry in Super5 and Super5 PLUS

The Simple Column price for Super5 is €3.00. The fixed price for Super5 PLUS is of €1.00 per column created.

The table below presents the number of Simple Columns created per Playing Board for the possible number of combinations according to the selected numbers in one Playing Board in Super5 and the respective cost of entry for the mentioned combinations.

7 Super5 Prizes

7.1 Winning Categories of Super5 and Super5 PLUS

To win in Super5 and Super5 PLUS, the player must match the selected numbers with the drawn numbers. The more numbers the player plays, the greater the winning probabilities.

Following is a table showing the corresponding odds for each Winning Category in Super5 and Super5 PLUS.

Winning Categories	Numbers Matched	Odds
1st Category	5 Correct Numbers	1,906,884
2nd Category	4 Correct Numbers	8,667.65
3rd Category	3 Correct Numbers	201.57

7.2 Distribution of Prizes in Super5

The prize money in a Super5 draw is dependent on the sales and is divided among the winners accordingly. The prize pool distributed among the Super5 winning ticket holders is 45% of the current draw total sales. An additional 5% is retained within the reserve fund for allocation to the guaranteed jackpot prize. The distribution of the prize pool per winning category is as outlined in the below table:

Winning Categories	Prize	
1st Category	68.5% of the prize pool	
2nd Category	13% of the prize pool	
3rd Category	18.5% of the prize pool	

If a winner is not found in any winning category, the corresponding amount is transferred to the same category of the next draw.

National Lottery plc. guarantees a minimum amount of $\le 500,000$ for the first winning category. If there is no Jackpot winner, the minimum guaranteed prize for the first category, for the next draw is automatically increased pro-rata according to sales with a minimum $\le 50,000$ weekly increase across all draws.



7.3 Distribution of Prizes in Super5 PLUS

The Super5 PLUS prize pool for winners is 45% of the current draw total sales. An additional 5% is retained within the reserve fund for allocation to the guaranteed first winning category prize. The distribution of the prize pool per winning category is as outlined in the below table:

Winning Categories	Prize	
1st Category	26.5% of the prize pool	
2nd Category	23.5% of the prize pool	
3rd Category	50% of the prize pool	

If a winner is not found in any winning category, the respective prize fund is added to the reserve pool.


National Lottery plc. guarantees a minimum winning amount of $\leq 150,000$ for the first winning category. If in any draw, there is more than one (1) simple column winning for the first winning category, then the prize is split according to the number of winning columns.



8 Examples

8.1 Simple Column Example




Playing Board: A

8.2 Systems Example




Playing Board: A

Number of Columns: 56 columns (8 numbers selected)

Cost of Ticket: 56 columns x €3.00 (basic price) = €168.00



8.3 Quick Pick Example



Playing Board: A


Quick Pick System: 6 (the system will pick 6 random numbers)

Number of Columns: 6

Cost of Ticket: 6 columns x €3.00 (basic price) = €18.00


Playing Board: C

Cost of Ticket: 1 column (Playing Board A) $x \in 3.00 + 6$ columns (Playing Board B) $x \in 3.00 + 1$ column (Playing Board C) $x \in 3.00 = 624.00$





Cost of Ticket: 1 column (Playing Board A) $x \in 3.00 + 1$ column (Playing Board B) x $\in 3.00 + 2$ columns (Super 5 PLUS) $x \in 1.00 = 68.00$

Cost of Ticket: 1 column (Game Area A) x €3.00 + €1.00 (Super5 PLUS) = €4.00
